THE MASS

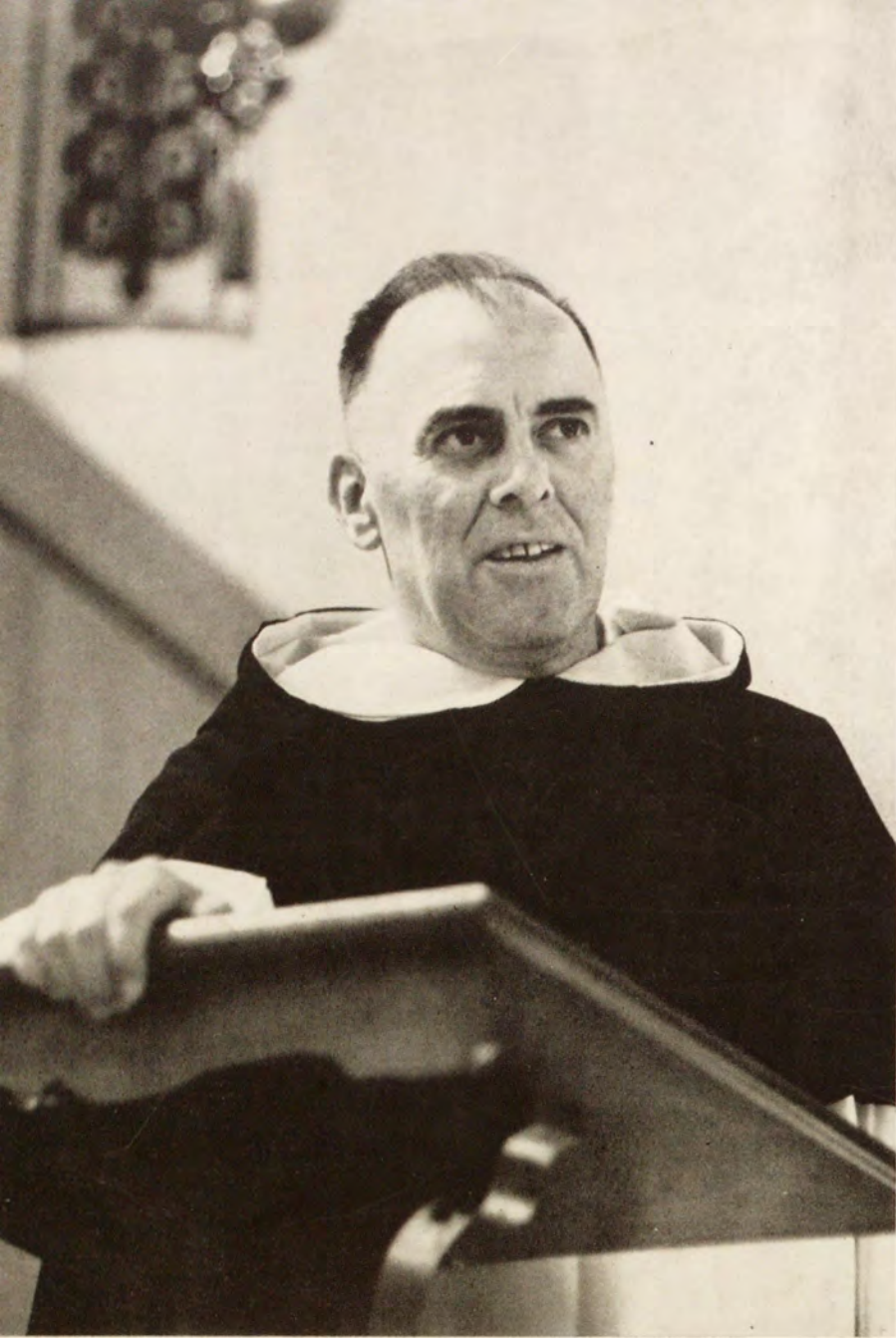
The Mass is the chief act of Catholic worship and "active participation in the most holy mysteries . . . is the first and indispensable source of the true Christian spirit."

In the pages that follow is presented the ways Faith illumines our life at Barry.







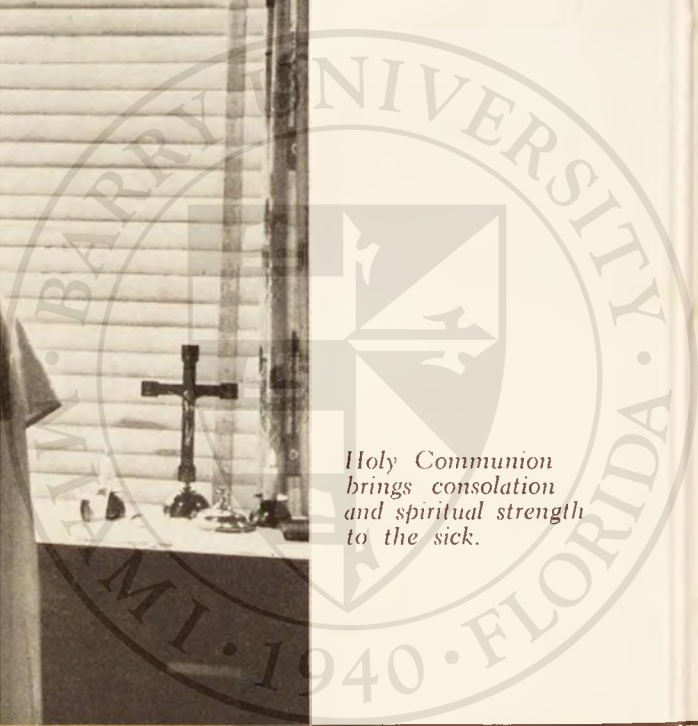

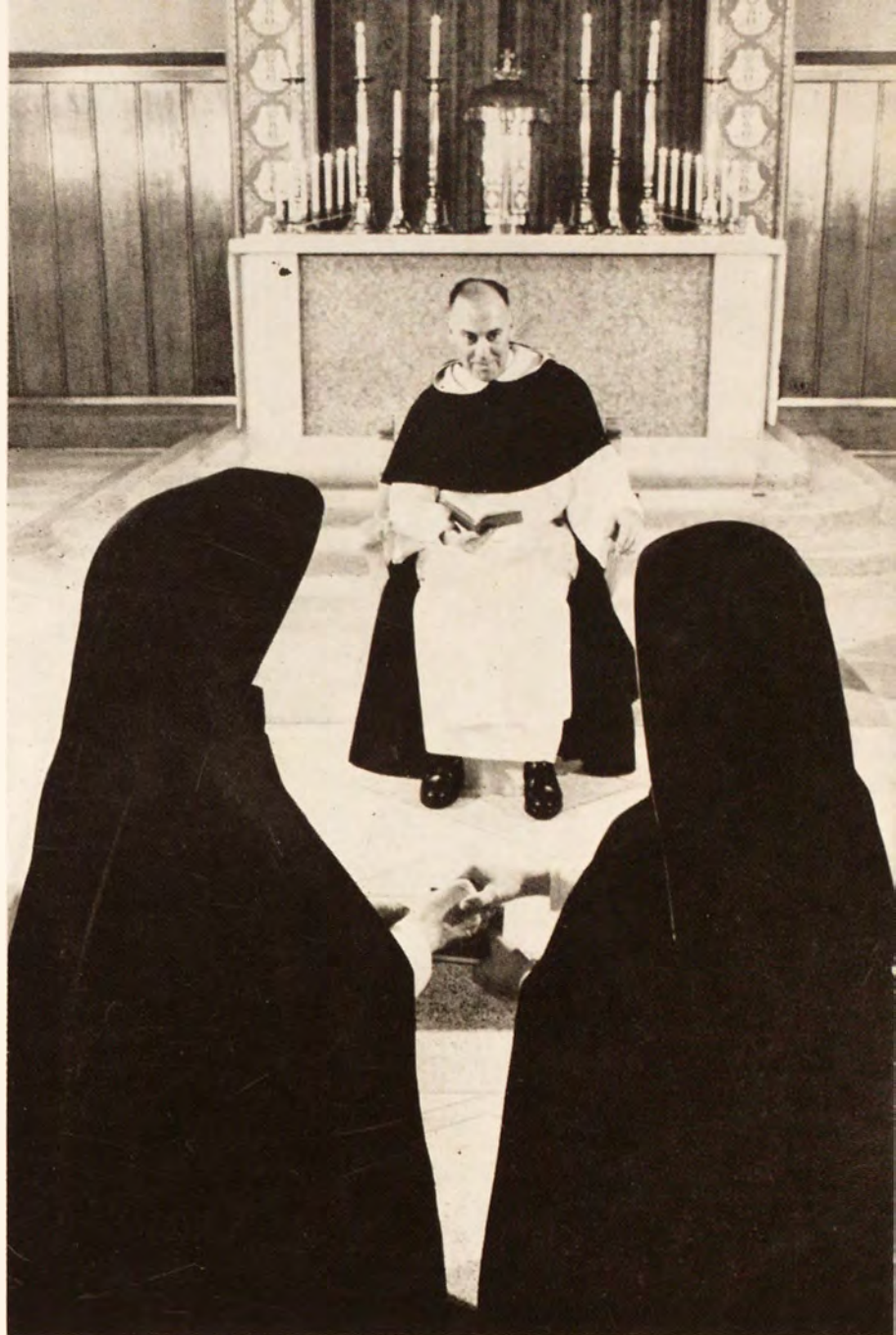

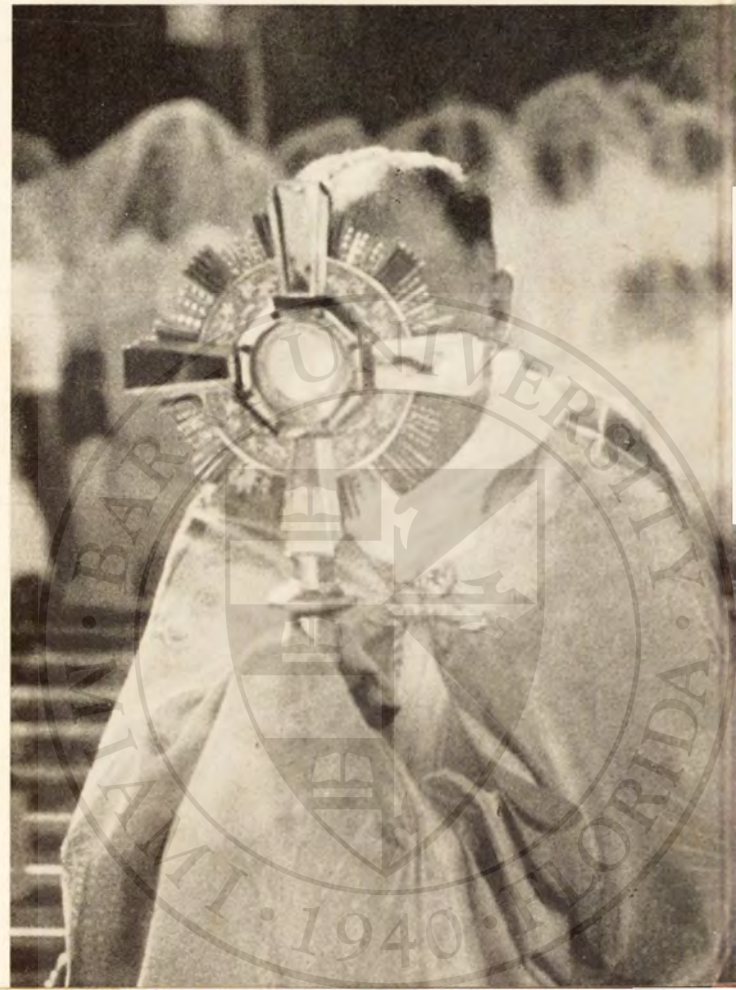

His Excellency Bishop Coleman Carroll

FEALTY--Faith's Precept

THE MOST REVEREND COLEMAN CARROLL offered his first Pontifical Mass in the Diocese in Cor Jesu Chapel on Founders' Day. Bishop Carroll, former Auxiliary Bishop of Pittsburgh, was installed as the first bishop of the diocese of Miami at St. Mary's Cathedral, October 7, 1958. To him, as our spiritual head, we of Barry College pledge our loyalty.



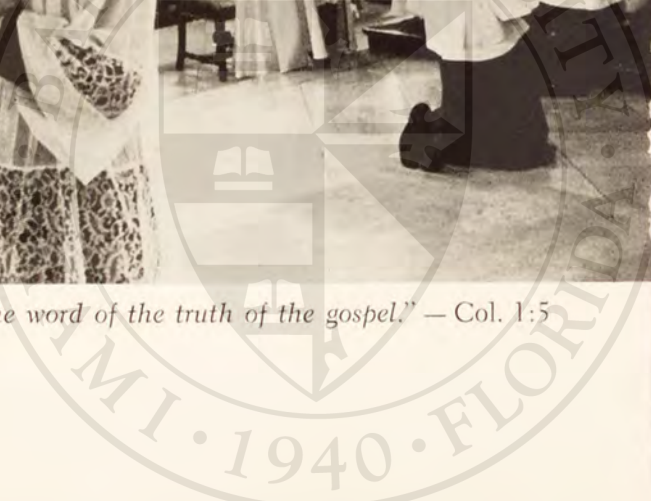
Since his arrival in Miami, Bishop Carroll has been very zealous. Among the many activities he has inaugurated are formation of a Serra Club to foster vocations, the total mobilization of the laymen in the diocese to carry out effective Catholic Action, the construction of a Retreat House, and the founding of *The Voice*, weekly publication of the Diocese of Miami.

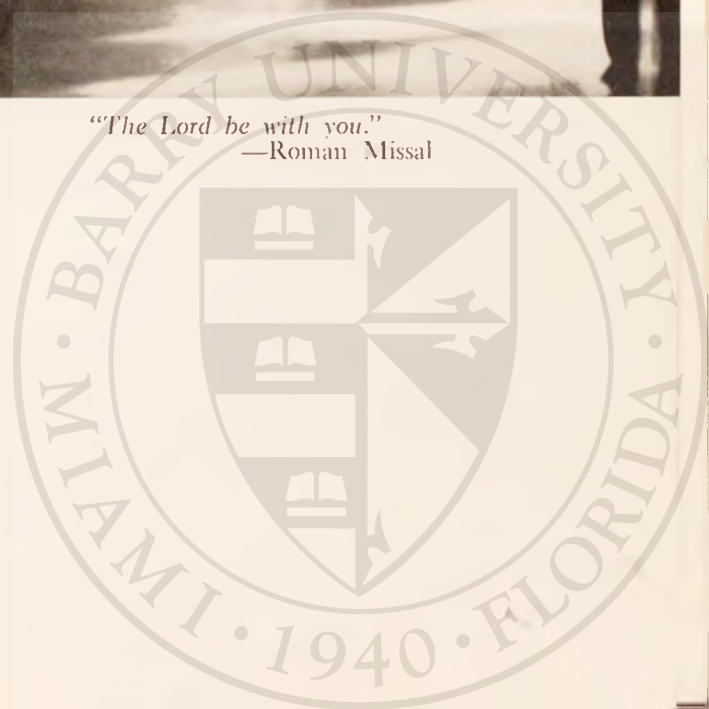

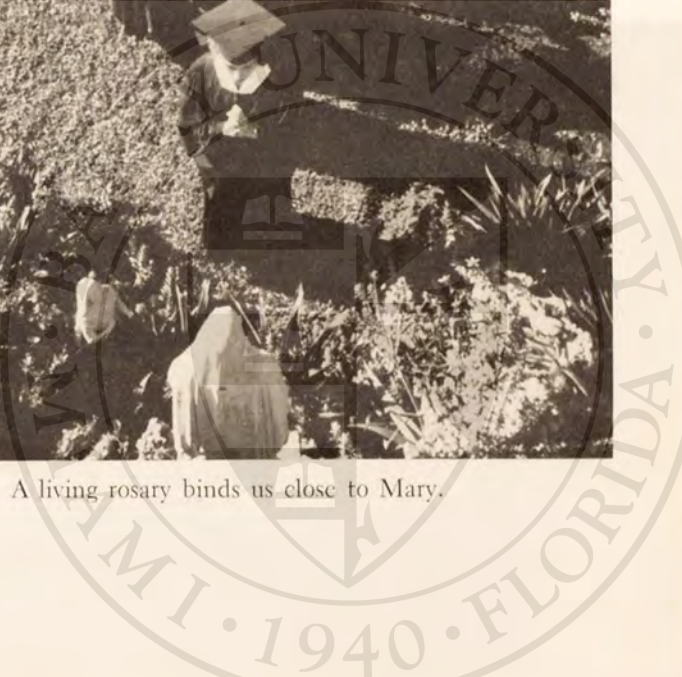

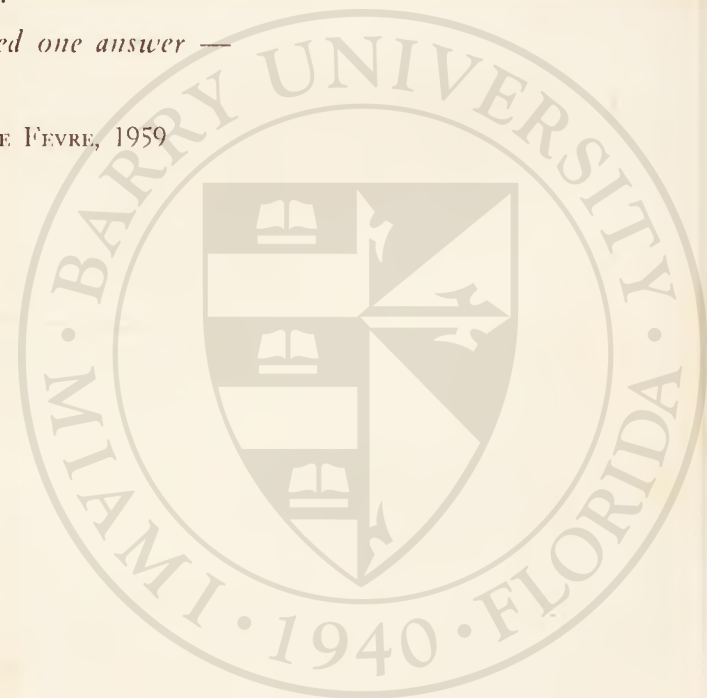

FOUNDERS DAY . . . AN ACADEMIC TRADITION

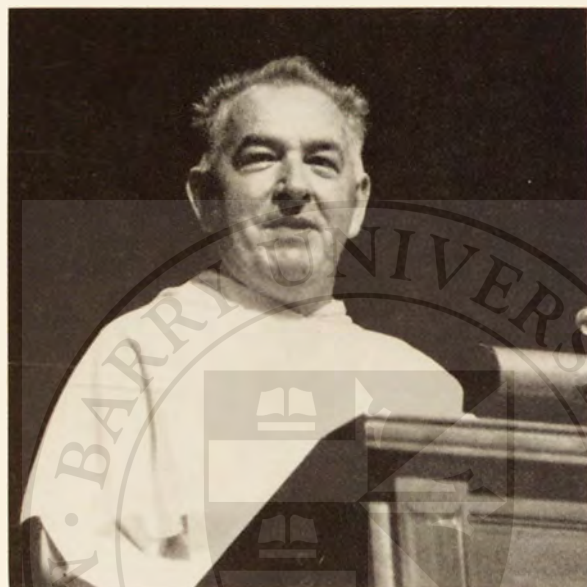

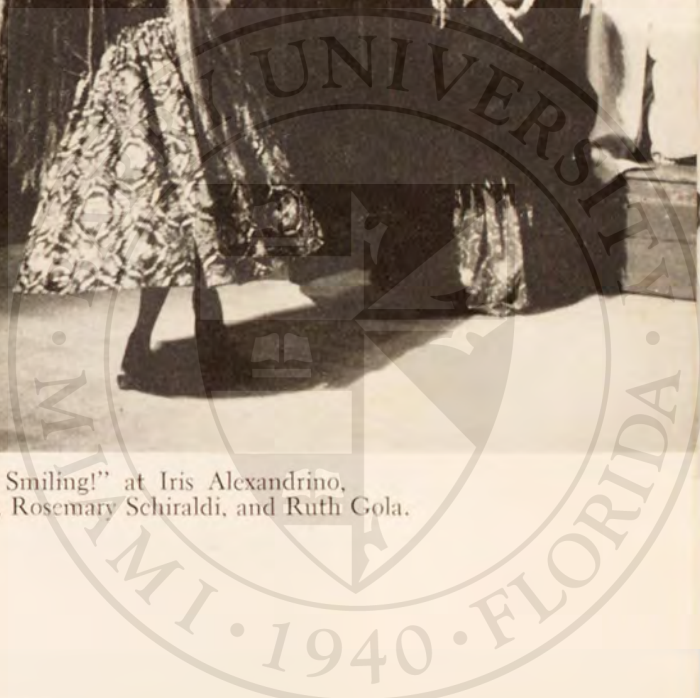

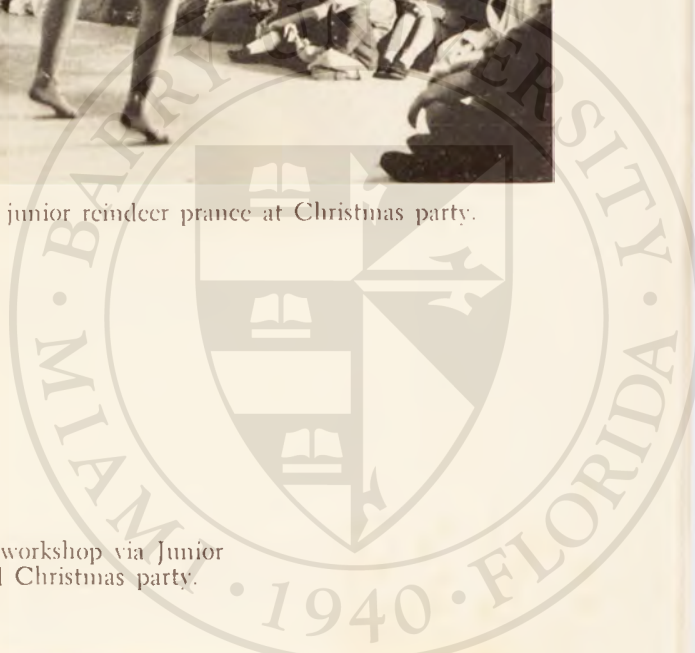
